SUBJECT: Coach Operator Performance Audit Results for January and February 2015

RECOMMENDATION

That the Board of Directors receive and file the Coach Operator Performance Audit results for the period covering January and February 2015.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no direct fiscal impact associated with the coach operator performance audit results.

BACKGROUND

The coach operator performance audits where conducted during the months of January 2015 through February 2015 in order to monitor the performance of the on street delivery provided by the Antelope Valley Transit Authority (AVTA) operations contractors (Transdev). The performance audits also provide AVTA with tools to monitor and evaluate operator performance and identify potential areas for improvement.

Audits are conducted randomly throughout the AVTA service area. For both months a total of 48 coach operator performance audits were conducted during weekday service. The auditor's boarded 36 local trips and 12 commuter trips, evaluating coach operator's performance on following criteria:

On Time Performance (OTP): 88% (42) of the trips observed by the auditors were on-time. Most delayed trips correlated to our local service, specifically on the Route 1 and the 786 service. In the upcoming service change Avail was used to calculate running times from real time. We hope that moving forward these improve the overall OTP for routes that are consistently running slightly behind schedules.

<u>Stop Announcements Made:</u> As is typical in this industry, the highest number of violations usually occurs due to operators not announcing stops. A total of 77% (37) operators did announce bus stop and or major intersections. Transdev continues to focus on reiterating the importance of announcing the FTA-required, ADA stop announcements. With the

coaches now fully integrated with the Avail "smart bus" system. All major stop and intersections announcements are now automatically announced as the bus moves through its route. However, operators are required to divert back to announcing stops in the event the system not operable. We expect that this metrics continue to improve in the next operator performance audit results.

<u>Driver Fare Acknowledgement:</u> When Moore & Associate auditors first board the bus, they will challenge the operator by depositing the incorrect fare or utilize an invalid Transit Access Pass (TAP) card or ask the pricing of a specific fare. In most cases, coach operators responded appropriately to fare questions or invalid media by quoting the proper fare. During the two month period (January - February) 100% (48) of all operators performed well.

Operator Courtesy: Operator courtesy consist of several interactions with the coach auditor, which may include but not limited to properly acknowledging the auditor as they board the bus after a greeting is initiated by the auditor, answering fare related or service question and interaction with other customers throughout the trip. If a customer is blatantly rude he or she will be marked down. During the two month period 73% (35) of the operators that were checked performed well and provided explorer customer service. "Operator Courtesy" continues to be one of the most improved metrics as we continue to move forward.

<u>Safe Vehicle Operations:</u> During the two month period all operators that were checked performed exceptionally well when it came to safe vehicle operations.

<u>Perfect Ride Check:</u> Coach Operators who had no violations on all performance metrics receive a "Perfect Ride Check" award and pin in recognition of their outstanding service. This number continues to grow as we move forward with the operator audits. During the two month period 63% (30) of the operators checked received no violations during their trips, resulting in a Perfect Ride check. An improvement of 27% over the last performance audit results.

<u>Bus Evaluation:</u> An average of 96% of bus evaluation metrics received a positive rating. The exception was exterior cleanliness, whereas four buses received a low rating. Of the 48 buses checked, 12 buses were rated as Excellent, 34 were rated as Good, two were rated fair and no coaches received a poor rating.

(Bus stop improvement and task order - \$53,945), Multimedia LED (Mobile LED digitally controlled advertisement sign - \$24,972). These items comprise 87.4% of total expenditures for the month.

As of February 2015, the total cash per the general ledger is \$20,378,350. After deducting restricted funds, the operating cash balance is \$5,700,858. The net of receivables inflows and accounts payables outflows is projected to be a net use of cash of \$1,524,074; the total expected cash available for operations in the next 30 days is \$7,224,932. The available cash is equal to 2.4 times the Authority's minimum cash balance target of \$3 million.

RECOMMENDATION

That the Board of Directors receive and file the FY15 Third Quarter Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department Report for the period covering January 1 through March 31, 2015.

FISCAL IMPACT

No fiscal impact at this time.

DISCUSSION

Deputy Maselli and his K-9 partner, leka, worked a total of 719 hours during the third quarter of FY15. Security Assistant Jessica McDaniel worked four hours and Randi Baker worked four hours during a Fare Enforcement Operation conducted in March.

Deputy Maselli monitored various locations that had reported problems. These locations included: Avenue J & Division Street, Avenue J & Challenger Way, Newgrove Avenue and 10th Street West, the Lancaster Senior Center, 6th Street East & Palmdale Boulevard, Courson Park and the Lancaster Metrolink Station.

At the beginning of each shift, Deputy Maselli contacted bus operators to ascertain if there were any concerns or problems to report, as well as anything that might have been reported from the previous day. On average, Deputy Maselli made contact with an estimated 29 operators per day. Throughout the third quarter of FY15, Maselli made contact with a total of 2,150 buses and approximately 35,350 passengers.

Deputy Maselli and leka conducted numerous high visibility K-9 terrorism and explosives deterrence sweeps on AVTA buses, at the AVTA office and at AVTA's two major transfer centers. Deterrence patrols were also conducted at random bus stop locations

throughout the Antelope Valley with a focus on problem areas identified by Deputy Maselli.

During the month of January Deputy Maselli made four arrests and issued five citations. All citations were transit-related and issued at transfer centers and bus stop locations. RECOMMENDATION

That the Board of Directors authorize the director of operations and maintenance to execute Contract #2015-31 for the replacement of a commercial photovoltaic grid-tied inverter to New Vision Construction, Valencia, CA, for the amount of \$68,200, plus applicable sales tax.

FISCAL IMPACT

Sufficient funds have been included in the FY15 Business Plan to pay for this service.

BACKGROUND

AVTA's photovoltaic voltage inverter No. 7 has been creating energy since 2004; however, it failed in 2014. The failed inverter is not in production and repair parts are no longer available to restore the unit. AVTA's only option is to replace the entire unit which is expected to put the solar array back into production.

The Board directed staff to reissue this solicitation at the March Board meeting. AVTA released an Invitation for Bids (IFB) on February 27, 2015. The solicitation documents were posted to AVTA's website and advertisements were placed in the *Antelope Valley Press* and *Our Weekly Lancaster* newsletter. Prior to issuance of the IFB, the Board and TAC members were notified and asked to submit any recommendations for potential vendors. The local Chambers of Commerce and Antelope Valley Board of Trade were also notified via their respective newsletters and email lists; a total of ten California firms were notified via email with the IFB attached. Three additional California firms and five (5) out-of-state

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firms registered and downloaded the IFB. Staff conducted a pre-bid conference on March 10, 2015, with one firm attending.

The bid opening was held on March 25, 2015. Of the 18 firms that received the IFB, only two (2) bids were received. CSI Electrical Contractors, Inc of Palmdale, CA, was rejected for not meeting warranty specifications. One firm bid and met all of the bid requirements. Their bid amount is listed in the table below.

New Vision's response was evaluted and their references were checked. Based on the bid received, the review of requisite documents submitted and the validation of references, staff is recommending that the Board approve a contract with New Vision Construction, of Valencia, CA. This project is anticipated to take approximately 120 days to complete.
